For the past 50 years, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops through its Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America has helped 25 countries in Central and South America as well as the Caribbean confront challenges to the faith. With your support, they have been able to develop catechetical programs and youth and young adult ministries, train lay leaders and catechists, and expand religious and seminary formation.

Please be generous in this collection, and take this opportunity to share your faith with families in Latin America and the Caribbean. Your support will truly make a difference.
