Blessed Virgin Mary Mother of God

This Thursday we will celebrate the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.** It is a holy day of obligation as we honor the Virgin Mary, our Parish's Patroness, who was preserved from all stain of original sin.

As the Mother of God, the Virgin Mary has a unique position among the saints, indeed, among all creatures. She is exalted, yet still one of us.

Redeemed by reason of the merits of her Son and united to Him by a close and indissoluble tie, she is endowed with the high office and dignity of being the Mother of the Son of God, by which account she is also the beloved daughter of the Father and the temple of the Holy Spirit. Because of this gift of sublime grace she far surpasses all creatures, both in heaven and on earth. At the same time, however, because she belongs to the offspring of Adam she is one with all those who are to be saved. (Viatican II's Document on the Church, *Lumen Gentium*, no. 53)

Mary embraces God's will and freely chooses to cooperate with God's grace, thereby fulfilling a crucial role in God's plan of salvation. Throughout the centuries, the Church has turned to the Blessed Virgin in order to come closer to Christ. Many forms of piety toward the Mother of God developed that help bring us closer to her Son. In these devotions to Mary, "while the Mother is honored, the Son, through whom all things have their being and in whom it has pleased the Father that all fullness should dwell, is rightly known, loved and glorified and . . . all His commands are observed." The Church honors her as the Mother of God, looks to her as a model of perfect discipleship, and asks for her prayers to God on our behalf. – *United States Conference of Bishops*

Refugee Resettlement Update: Looking for Interpreters

Thanks to the support of this parish and many local residents, the Refugee Resettlement Committee—Ridgefield (RRCR), in partnership with co-sponsoring agency I.R.I.S., is almost ready to help a refugee family start a new life in Connecticut. However, we recently learned from I.R.I.S. that our chance of getting assigned a family from a place other than Syria is higher than we originally expected. The family may now come from a different country such as Afghanistan, The Congo or Eritrea. As a result, we may need interpreters for the following languages: Pashto, Farsi, Urdu, Swahili, Tigrinya. Do you know of people with any of these language skills who may be able to help family members as they transition to a new life here? Translators are needed for visits to social service, medical and school appointments, grocery shopping and more. We will need translators at varying times of the day and evenings. Ideally, these volunteers would live nearby, although smartphones and Skype are options. The need for translators will be great through March and will gradually decrease as the adults learn English. If you have suggestions of individuals or resources for possible translators in the above languages, please email us at RRCRidgefield@gmail.com.
