### DEFENDING OUR RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

Fifty years ago, the Second Vatican Council adopted a declaration on religious freedom called, *Dignitatis Humanae*. In it, it says that religious freedom includes the freedom to practice our faith in public. In our culture, some tend to think that religious liberty means only that individuals can worship without interference from the government. This understanding is inadequate. Religious schools, hospitals, and charities should be able to operate in accordance with their faith. Indeed, the work of these organizations is part and parcel of their faith. They are expressions of religious mission, and religions must have the space to live out their missions.

Let us pray that legislators who work to replace the federal health care mandate will read and be inspired by *Dignitatis Humanae*.

### FAITH FORMATION CORNER

#### Praying with the Saints

The saints help us in two main ways: as companions and as patrons. As companions, they offer us examples of how to lead Christian lives. But they do so in particular ways. St. Peter was different from St. Francis of Assisi, who was in turn different from St. Therese of Lisieux. Each saint was holy in his or her own way, and their individual lives show us that we can be holy in our own ways. Being a saint means being yourself—nothing more, but more important, nothing less. The saints are also our patrons, the ones who pray for us. Some people misunderstand this aspect of Catholicism, believing that Catholics “worship” the saints, as if they were God. Of course the saints are not God—and they would be the first to tell you this! Some people also mistakenly think Catholics believe saints “answer” prayers. No, God does this. Saints simply pray for us in heaven, much as a friend on earth would pray for us. We also pray with the saints by reading their writings, meditating on their lives and finally, by following their examples—helping the poor, living a prayerful life, and exercising charity. In this way, their roles as patron and companion are joined, and we find ourselves slowly becoming saints in our own lives. *In All Seasons For All Reasons – J. Martin, SJ*
