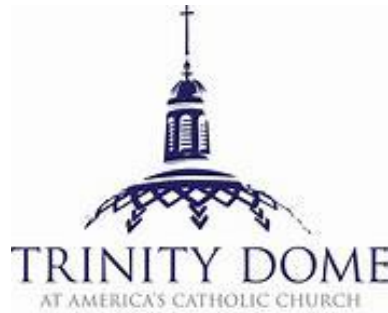

On December 8th the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary Lectionary, Donald Cardinal Wuerl, Archbishop of Washington, blessed the completed mosaic in the Trinity Dome of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. Five cardinals, twenty-three bishops, nearly ninety priests and over four-thousand religious and lay faithful gathered to celebrate the event.

As you know, Bishop Caggiano had asked parishes in our Diocese, that were able, to make a voluntary contribution toward to project to help offset the Diocese of Bridgeport's \$300,000 project assessment. Sixty-three Parishes in the Diocese made contributions for a combined total of \$131,504.62!

Thank you to all in our Parish who were able to participate and gave so generously to the Dome Project, which will inspire countless Catholics and pilgrims to Washington for years to come.

DEFENDING OUR RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

Fifty years ago, the Second Vatican Council adopted a declaration on religious freedom called, *Dignitatis Humanae*. In it, it says that religious freedom includes the freedom to practice our faith in public. In our culture, some tend to think that religious liberty means only that individuals can worship without interference from the government. This understanding is inadequate. Religious schools, hospitals, and charities should be able to operate in accordance with their faith. Indeed, the work of these organizations is part and parcel of their faith. They are expressions of religious mission, and religions must have the space to live out their missions.

Let us pray that legislators who work to replace the federal health care mandate will read and be inspired by *Dignitatis Humanae*.

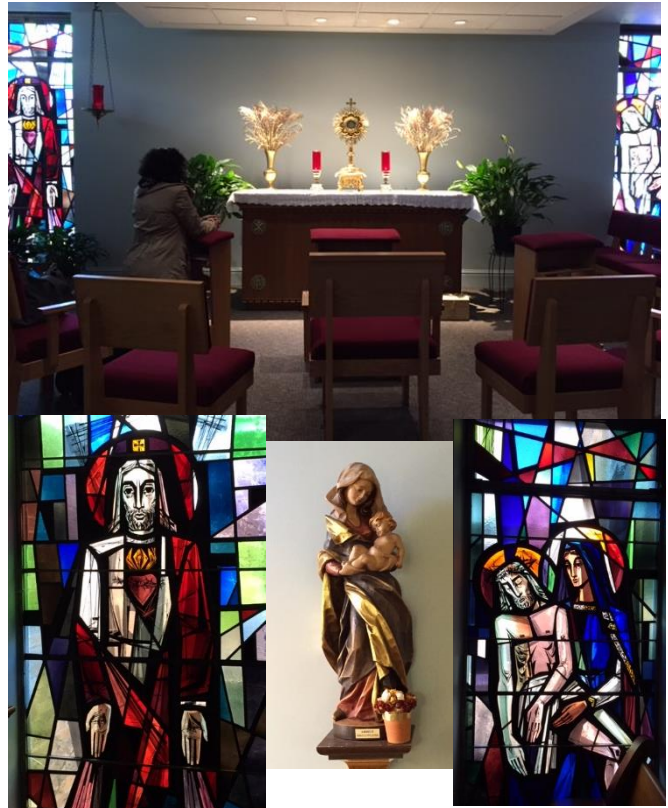
DONATE: FOOD PANTRY
